Complex Surgery for a 61 Year Old Patient

A 61-year-old patient visited the general surgery clinic with persistent pain and weight loss.

Examinations revealed a large mass behind the peritoneum, pressing on the pancreas and arteries.

A complex surgery, led by a skilled medical team, successfully removed the mass.

The patient was transferred to intensive care and later discharged after kidney function was restored.

Pathological examination showed the mass was a highly malignant tumor.


