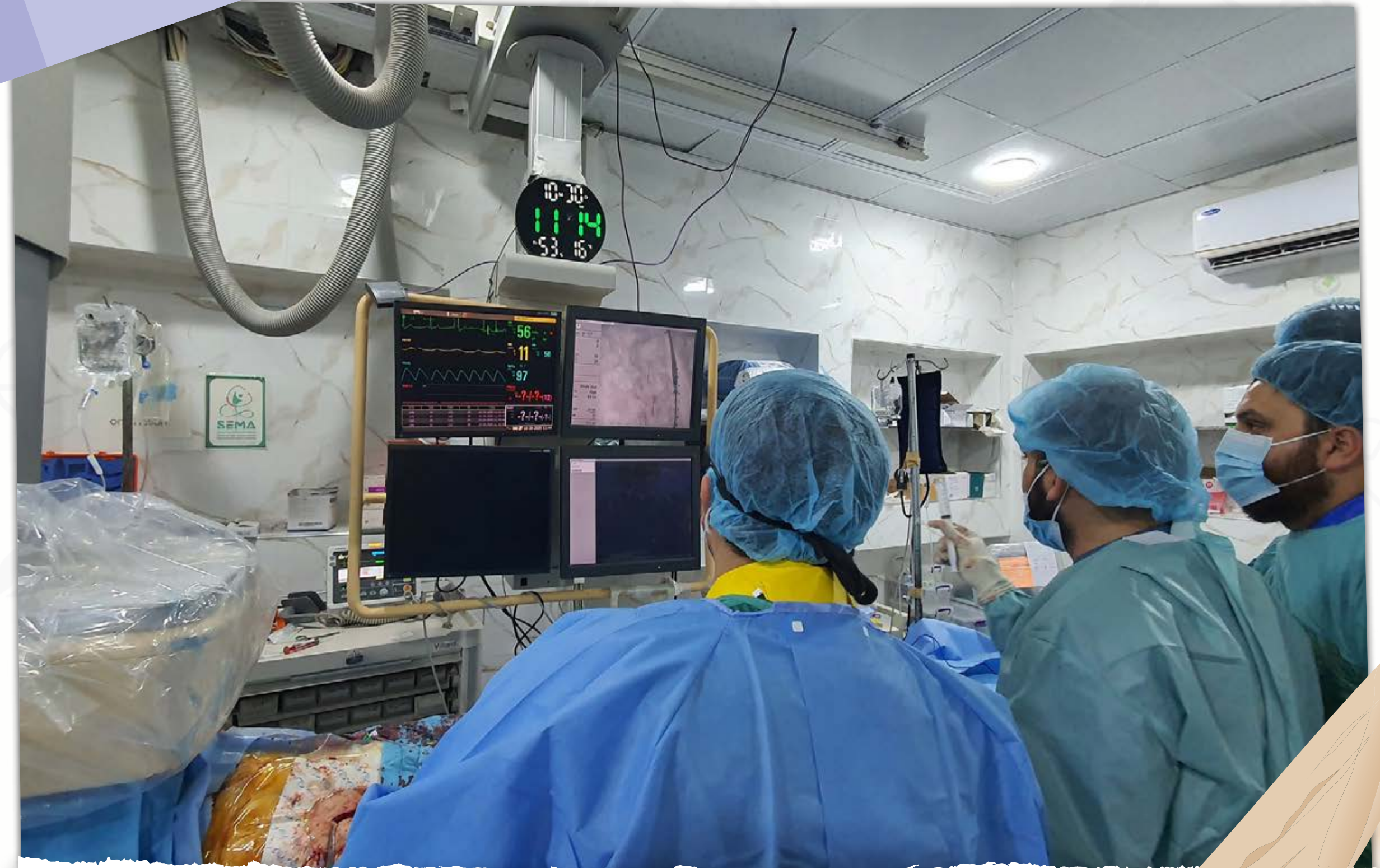
SUCCESS STORIES

A New Milestone Medical Achievement at the Specialized Surgical Hospital

In a new medical achievement that opens advanced horizons for interventional treatment in northern Syria, the Specialized Surgical Hospital in Idlib, funded in partnership with the European Union and implemented by SEMA, successfully performed the first procedure of its kind to repair an abdominal aortic aneurysm (EVAR - Endovascular Aneurysm Repair).

The procedure was performed on a patient in his sixties who was suffering from a severe abdominal aortic aneurysm measuring 65 mm in diameter, in addition to cardiomyopathy and ischemia.

This intervention represents a qualitative step forward in the field of endovascular surgery, as it is considered the optimal solution for such high-risk cases, with a significantly lower complication rate compared to open surgery. The patient was discharged from the hospital after only 36 hours, in excellent condition.

A Journey of Hope... Hussein's Story with Dialysis at SEMA Center in Kafrtakharim

Hussein's journey with illness was not an easy one.

At 41 years old, and originally from Harem in the Idlib countryside, Hussein faced a life-changing health challenge that reshaped his daily life.

His story began while he was living in Türkiye, when he experienced a sudden rise in blood pressure and sought medical care. Medical examinations revealed very high creatinine levels, and he was informed that his kidneys were no longer able to function properly. From that moment, his journey with kidney dialysis began.

After returning to Syria seven months later, Hussein began searching for a center where he could continue his treatment. His journey led him to the SEMA Dialysis Center in Kafrtakharim, where he found not only medical care, but also compassion, dignity, and genuine humanitarian support.

SEMA Conducts Specialized Training to Strengthen the Capacity of Protection Teams in Idlib

The Protection Department at SEMA conducted a specialized training program covering three main areas: identification and referral, awareness of war remnants, and child protection.

Held in Idlib, the training targeted SEMA's protection teams and volunteer groups, aiming to enhance their capacities and strengthen their skills in dealing with various protection cases, while enabling them to apply protection standards and deliver effective field responses.

This training comes as part of SEMA's ongoing efforts to build the capacities of protection staff and to ensure the provision of high-quality services that respect the dignity of beneficiaries and meet the needs of the most vulnerable groups in the community.
